This project needs to be managed strategically with the goal of expanding it to the entire health care system of the new department.• Provide a transitional organization that will establish contracted health care services at the regional and local level in areas where the university pilot project is not yet operational.• Establish a management group with members from the new department with university involvement to plan and implement the transition from current operations to the new planned health care provision.• Establish a Correctional Health Care Policy Advisory Committee that includes representation from the University of California, the health care community, and state health officials.• Negotiate of an agreement with the UC under which the university would eventually provide or oversee the provision of pharmacy services.	<p>The University of California (UC) is willing to enter a dialogue with the Department of Corrections to help review and evaluate new approaches that could make California's prison health services more efficient and effective. UC would enter into these discussions with the understanding that it has no plan or ability to increase our direct provision of health care to inmates. We will work as task force members, committee members and consultants on an ad hoc, voluntary basis. We would participate in these discussions with the understanding that our willingness to examine these issues does not presuppose that UC will become involved in comprehensive delivery of care to inmates on or off site at UC health facilities, or that any of the Panel's recommendations for a UC-run pilot project, or UC's provision or oversight of prison health services are feasible, given the University's primary teaching and research mission and our limited resources.</p>
