# **Guidelines – Project Summary Table and Sheets**

June 2015

#### I. UPDATES

Changes to the 2015-25 Capital Financial Plan (CFP):

- Project Summary Table has been divided in to two tables:
  - 2015-25 Capital Program. The program is displayed in two sections and includes the non-State Capital and the State General Funds Financed Capital Programs.
  - Five-Year State Capital Outlay Plan. This table represents the campus' important Statesupportable seismic and life safety projects and projects that address critical campus needs.
- Display of project information in years 6-10. Based on conversation with the campuses, we have added the option to summarize the last five years.
- Display of updates to the CFP. The table will include annotations of how the plan has been updated since 2014-24.
- Capital Markets Finance will continue to use the Debt Affordability Model 1.0 for the 2015-25 CFP. It is recommended that campuses continue to update version 2.0.

Future guidelines will address streamlining of campus' narratives and addressing documenting alternative funding plans for projects listed in the Five-Year State Capital Outlay Plan.

## II. PROJECT SUMMARY TABLE

The Project Summary Table includes:

- Projects with a total cost greater than \$5M.
- Projects that have been previously accepted or approved in the 2015-16 fiscal year.
- Projects funded prior to 2014-15 which have additional funding in 2015-16 and/or beyond.
- Project starts scheduled in the last years of the 2015-25 CFP that have funding phases (W, C or E) occurring after the last year of the program. The total should be for the total project.
- Proposed projects to be implemented through a privatized development arrangement. It is understood that costs may not be possible or prudent to publish

## **Project costs**

 Costs in 2016-17 and beyond to be benchmarked to July 1, 2016 at CCCI 6392 and EPI 3277.  Total project cost should include equipment and for externally financed projects, interest during construction.

- Do not change formatting on the sheet. The first two years are posted on the web.
- Real estate projects may be eligible for Design/supporting CEQA approval through the Delegated Process; complete the real estate transaction found in the Project Sheet that most accurately reflects the planned transaction.
