

Policy on Recordings of [Academic][Instructional] Presentations

A. Distribution and Publication: No business, agency or person shall give, sell or otherwise distribute or publish course lecture notes, or any recording, in any medium, of any course given at the University of California, nor use such lecture notes or recording for any commercial purpose without the written consent of the instructor.

Exception: Students enrolled in or auditing a course may take lecture notes and, with the permission of the instructor, make sound recordings of the class, for the purpose of individual or group study or for other non-commercial purposes reasonably arising from participation in the course. Students enrolled in or auditing a course may also provide such course lecture notes or sound recording to other students for the purpose of individual or group study or for other non-commercial purposes reasonably arising from participation in the course.

B. Capture of Sounds and Images: Recordings of classes at the University of California that capture the actual sounds and/or images of those classes, in any medium, shall not be distributed or communicated for commercial purposes without a written agreement between the instructor and the University. This prohibition includes recordings made by any person with the instructor's written consent. (*Note: Distributions or communications, without the instructor's written consent, are forbidden under paragraph A, above.*) Any such agreement must consider not only the rights of the instructor and the University, but also those of third parties. It may be necessary to secure rights from these third parties before any distribution or communication takes place.
