

## **FRANK ZWART**

Associate Vice Chancellor Frank Zwart has served as Campus Architect at the University of California, Santa Cruz, since August 1988. Prior to joining the University, Mr. Zwart worked in architectural firms in Carmel, Aptos, Santa Monica and Los Angeles, California, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and in Princeton, New Jersey.

He received his Bachelor of Arts degree in 1971, with honors in mathematics and college honors from Cowell College at the University of California, Santa Cruz, where he was a Regents' Scholar. His architectural training was at Princeton University, where he received a Master of Architecture degree in 1976. While at Princeton, he received the Butler Traveling Fellowship during the summer of 1975 and the Carrère Scholarship for 1974-75 from the American Institute of Architects. He has been a registered architect in California since 1980.

Mr. Zwart is a member of the American Institute of Architects, the Society for College and University Planning, and the Association of University Architects (AUA). In June 2006 Frank received the Association of University Architects Distinguished Service Award given to individuals who have made a significant contribution in building and planning for higher education.
