The Director of Campus Diversity Initiatives is responsible for the development and implementation of campus diversity activities, including initiatives proposed and planned by the Director as a result of analyses of campus diversity needs, as well as priorities identified and recommended by the Associate Chancellor/Chief Diversity Officer (CDO). As the primary contact and liaison for the Chancellor's Advisory Committees: the Diversity Council, the Committee on the Status of Women, and the Committee on Gender Identity and Sexual Orientation Issues; she supports their missions to achieve a diverse, welcoming and inclusive campus community. She also functions as a key administrative liaison to the campus in general in communicating information about campus diversity issues, advising the CDO and campus leadership about diversity needs, and planning and implementing activities in response to identified needs.

Prior to this assignment, she served as the Senior Student Development Officer for Engineering Student Services in the UC San Diego Jacobs School of Engineering. Glynda was responsible for creation and coordination of student support processes for new undergraduate team initiatives in the Jacobs School: Team Internships to provide solutions for industry customers and Teams in Engineering Service (TIES) to address the technology challenges of not-for-profit community clients. She also directs the Access to Careers in Engineering (ACE) program activities and strategies to promote retention of economically and educationally disadvantaged engineering students (formerly the MESA Engineering Program). Previous to this assignment, she served as an advisor and computer programming instructor for the Department of Freshman Engineering at Purdue University, as adjunct staff to the Minority Engineering Program at Purdue University, Staff Resident for Purdue University Student Housing, and was an active student member of the National Society of Black Engineers.

Glynda received her B.S. in Engineering, Biomedical Field of Study, and M.S. in Electrical Engineering from Purdue University. She is a member of the American Council on Education; and a former member of the National Association of Minority Engineering Program Administrators, American Society for Engineering Education and a founding member of the Concerned Parents Alliance, Inc. of San Diego, CA.
