

Matthew St.Clair is the first Sustainability Manager for the University of California's Office of the President, leading sustainability efforts across the 10-campus UC system since 2004.

Mr. St.Clair is a founding member of the Board of Directors for the Association for the Advancement of Sustainability in Higher Education. He is a member of the Board of Directors of Strategic Energy Innovations, a non-profit organization implementing energy conservation programs in California. He also serves on the Chancellor's Advisory Committees on Sustainability at UC Berkeley, UC San Francisco, UC Santa Cruz, and UC Merced. He is a co-founder of the Berkeley Environmental Alumni Network.

Mr. St.Clair has delivered lectures at numerous universities, been an invited keynote speaker at several regional and national conferences, and has advised the U.S. House of Representatives on the formation of an Office of Sustainability for the U.S. Capitol. He has been profiled in *Business Week* and *Business Officer* magazines, and was given the 2007 Sustainability Champion award at the 6<sup>th</sup> Annual California University Sustainability Conference in June 2007.

Mr. St.Clair has a background in environmental policy and advocacy, working on international campaigns for Friends of the Earth Czech Republic and on renewable energy policy research at the Lawrence Berkeley National Laboratory. He has also held research assistant positions or internships with the U.S. House of Representatives Committee on Science, the California Public Utilities Commission, the Environmental Protection Agency's Office of International Activities, the Worldwatch Institute, and the Natural Resources Defense Council.

Mr. St.Clair has a Masters degree in environmental policy from the Energy and Resources Group at UC Berkeley and a Bachelors degree in economics from Swarthmore College. He is a LEED Accredited Professional.
