Steve Lustig is the Associate Vice Chancellor-Health and Human Services (HHS) for UC Berkeley, a division that includes Human Resources, Environment, Health and Safety, University Health Services, Disability Management Services and the Staff Ombuds Office. In his role, Steve manages over 400 FTE and an annual operating budget of \$70 million dollars.

Health and Human Services provides leadership, vision and coordination of its services to optimize the success and well being of the campus community at both the individual and organizational level.

The goals of Health and Human Services are to:

- Sustain a safe, healthy and engaging campus in which to live, work and study
- Foster an inclusive community to enhance success, recruitment and retention
- Strengthen the effectiveness of HHS programs, services and systems.

In recent years, Steve Lustig has also served as the Acting Vice Chancellor - Business and Administrative Services and Acting Assistant Vice Chancellor - Human Resources, and the Assistant Vice Chancellor, University Health and Counseling Services.

Steve brings to his roles a personal history of involvement with both the campus and community. A long-time resident of Berkeley, he received his BA in Social Science and two Masters in Folklore and Medical Anthropology from U.C. Berkeley. He has been a lecturer and adjunct faculty member at Sonoma State, University of San Francisco, and UC Berkeley in the areas of Anthropology, Medical Anthropology, and Organizational Development. Steve served as President of the Berkeley School Board, President of Stiles Hall (a local mentoring program involving Cal students), and founder of the Berkeley High School Health Center.

In 2007, Steve received the Ollie B. Moten Award from the American College Health Association for having a significant impact on the institution of higher education at which he works.
