Proposed Presidential Policy and Guidelines

POLICY ON STEWARDSHIP OF ELECTRONIC INFORMATION RESOURCES

Information technology management policies and practices essential for:

- effective stewardship of information resources
- proper functioning of the University
- ensuring protection of privacy and confidentiality

Scope: campuses, medical centers, national laboratories
Responsibility: IR&C, UCOP responsible for policy
Campuses responsible for implementation

Stewardship Guidelines provide general direction for:

- Electronic information management (see IS-2 - revised)
- Electronic information security (IS-3 - revised)
- Identity and access management (IS-11 - new)
- Continuity planning and disaster recovery (IS-12 - new)
- Common IT Infrastructure
