RE: 2002/2003 Spring Assembly report

**The Committee is charged** with fulfilling its standing charge, Article VIII. Section 1.j.1.

- a) Review annually, or at the special request of the President, the LAUC Bylaws and submit recommendations to the President.
- b) Review the Divisions' Bylaws to assure that they are consistent with the LAUC Bylaws (See Article VI, Section 2.d.)
- c) Address other subjects at the request of the President and consider and develop recommendations on matters concerning LAUC's committees, rules and jurisdiction.

**Specific Charge** for 2002/2003

Specifically, the Committee is charged with the following, in priority order. Once the Committee has completed or undertaken the majority of the work on the first item below, you can move on to the next one. It is possible that the Committee may not be able to address or complete work on all of these charges during the coming year. If not, please provide recommendations for next year's Committee in your final report.

SC1. Given the large number of LAUC representatives on various UL and CDL committees, the Committee on Committees is charged with reviewing the LAUC committee structure, and comparing it to the UL All-Campus Groups, as well as the statewide Academic Senate's committee structure.

SC2. In addition, the Committee is charged with considering the following possible bylaws changes:

Article IV. Officers.

Section 1: Add: Past-President.

Article VI. Divisions

Section 2: Add: [new] d. All Divisions shall review their own Divisional bylaws for any necessary changes following changes to LAUC statewide bylaws.

[new] f. Divisions shall notify the LAUC Committee on Committees, Rules and Jurisdiction of any changes to their Divisional bylaws, immediately following those changes.

j.1.a. annually

j.1.b. (See Article VI, Section 2.e.)

Article VIII. Committees

Section 1. Add:

j.3.a. Serve as the soliciting and review body...

SC3. LAUC membership has decreased over the years at all campuses, due primarily to budget cuts. In addition, the figures given for LAUC Assembly delegates count do not seem consistent. Divisions with up to 35 members get one delegate, while Divisions must have over 160 members in order to get four delegates. Incremental increases from one category to the next also seem inconsistent. In order to get two delegates, a Division must have 36 to 85 LAUC members, up to 50 more members than those Divisions that have one delegate. In order to get three delegates, a Division must have 86 to 160 LAUC members, an increment of up to 75 additional LAUC members. The Committee is charged with reexamining the apportionment of Division delegates to the Assembly, as enumerated in Article VII. Section 2.c., to ensure appropriate membership representation.

SC4. Finally, the Committee is charged with reviewing Article XII. Section 1. which describes the process for recommending, amending and voting on bylaws changes, and gaining approval from the Office of the President.

**Summary of Action Items:**

**SC1. Reviewing the LAUC committee structure.** As the first step, a table has been prepared. comparing: a) Academic Senate standing committees, b) LAUC standing committees, and c) University Librarians standing committees.

**SC2. Bylaw changes.** The process is described in Article XII. Amendments. Section I. The Committee on Committees, Rules, and Jurisdiction shall review the Bylaws annually, or by special request of the President, to determine whether or not amendments are appropriate. This committee shall submit its recommendations to the President and, at the recommendation of the President, to the Assembly.

\*Any text to be deleted is shown in [brackets]; new text to be inserted or substituted is underlined.

*The Committee recommends the following Bylaw amendments:*

Article IV. Officers.

Section 1. The officers of LAUC shall be President, Vice President (President-Elect), Secretary, and Past President.

Article VI. Divisions.

Section 2.d. All Division shall review their own Divisional bylaws for any necessary changes following changes to LAUC Bylaws.

Section 2.e. Whereas the LAUC Bylaws set certain restrictions on the organization of Divisions, Divisional Bylaws shall be subject to review by the Standing Committee on Committees, Rules, and Jurisdiction. (See Article VIII, Section 1.j.1.)

Section 2.f. Divisions shall notify the Committee on Committees, Rules and Jurisdiction of any changes to their Divisional bylaws, immediately following those changes.

Article VIII. Committees.

Section 1.j.1.a Duties of the Standing Committees. Review [annually, or] at the [special] request of the President, the LAUC Bylaws and submit recommendations to the President. (See Article XII, Section 1)

Article VIII. Committees

Section 1.j.3.a. Serve as the soliciting and review body for research proposals submitted to the University-wide Research Grants for Librarians Program by LAUC members and recommend funding of proposals to the Office of the President.

**SC3. Apportionment of Division delegates to the Assembly.** As described in Article VII, Section 2.c., the number of representatives for each Division is calculated based on each Division's LAUC membership according to ranges of numbers, e.g. a Division with thirty-five members of LAUC has two delegates. The Academic Senate provides the following model.

*The Committee recommends the following Bylaw amendment:*

Delete existing text and replace with:

Article VII. Assembly. Section 2. Membership. c. Thirty Divisional Representatives are members of the Assembly. The LAUC Executive Board shall annually prorate the distribution on September 1 among the Divisions in proportion to their memberships. Representatives from each Division shall be the Chair, or his/her alternate, plus the other representatives. Each Division shall determine its own method of choosing its Representatives.

#### **SC4. Article XII. Amendments. Section 1.**

*The Committee recommends the following Bylaw amendment:*

The Committee on Committees, Rules, and Jurisdiction shall review the Bylaws [annually, or] by [special] request of the President, to determine whether or not amendments are appropriate. This Committee shall submit recommendations to the President and, at the recommendation of the President, to the Assembly. (See Article VIII. Section 1.j.1.a)

#### **Approval of Assembly Minutes**

Issues: a) electronic approval, b) waiting for approval until next Assembly when the cast of characters has changed seems questionable, and 3) timely approval.

*The Committee recommends the following Bylaw amendment:*

Article III. Assembly. Section 3. Meetings. g. Minutes of Assembly and general membership meetings shall be prepared by the Secretary.

- 1) The Secretary shall distribute the minutes to all members of the Assembly within thirty days following a meeting. Minutes may be approved via e-mail or other electronic device.
- 2) The Secretary shall distribute the minutes to the University Librarian on each campus, to the Chancellor or other officer to whom a LAUC member reports, and to the Office of the President.
- 3) Each Division shall make minutes of meetings available to its members.

#### **Nomination Rules for Secretary**

Article IX. Elections. Section 3.b.

Issues: Are the nomination rules for Secretary the same as for Vice President? Are the eligibility rules the same, e.g. “not from the same Division”? Needs clarification. This will be a topic at the Spring LAUC Executive Board meeting. The Nominating Committee, Parliamentarian, and Chair of this Committee have

expressed interpretations. One caveat is the time restriction. Sometimes it is difficult to find candidates to stand for election. Reducing the time requirement may be prudent?

*The Committee recommends the following Bylaw amendment:*

[b. Candidates for office shall not be from the same Division, or from the same Division as the current Vice President (President-Elect). Candidates for office shall not be from a Division which has had one of its members serve in the same office during either of the two previous years.]

b. Candidates for either office shall not be from the same Division. Candidates for Secretary shall not be from the same Division as the current Vice President (President-Elect). Candidates for Vice President (President-Elect) shall not be from the same Division as the current Secretary. Candidates for office shall not be from a Division which has had one of its members serve in the same office during either of the two terms of office preceding the current term of office.
