(1) Data are from the UCAP files: 3/29/07 for Davis & San Diego for Fall 2007 and 4/03/07 for all other campuses for Fall 2007, 3/31/08 for Fall 2008 and 3/26/09 for Fall 2009.

(2) For 2007 and 2008, the Asian American category includes applicants who declared themselves as Chinese, East Indian/Pakistani, Japanese, Korean, Vietnamese, and other Asian. For 2009, the category includes applicants who declared themselves as Asian Indian, Bangladeshi, Cambodian, Chinese, Hmong, Indonesian, Japanese, Korean, Laotian, Malaysian, Pakistani, Sri Lankan, Taiwanese, Thai, Vietnamese, and other Asian.

(3) For 2007 and 2008, the Pacific Islander category was broadly defined. The drop seen for 2009 may be due to the more narrowly defined categories of Fijian, Guamanian/Chamorro, Hawaiian, Samoan, Tongan, and other Pacific Islander as well as options for applicants to declare themselves as one of the new Asian categories.

(4) Decline to state include students who did not provide information on their ethnic identity in the admission application.

(5) Out-of-state, international and referral students are not included in this report. Bona fide residents on a non-immigrant visa are also excluded.

(6) *Data include students who were offered admissions to Berkeley and San Diego for Winter/Spring terms.
