Economic Impacts

UC Berkeley is the largest employer in Alameda County with more than 18,000 employees and an annual payroll of \$453.5 million. It generates new tax revenues from its payroll totaling \$15.3 million per month. Monthly disbursements by the campus total \$56.7 million. Its annual total economic impact is more than \$1 billion statewide.

Additionally, the Lawrence Berkeley National Laboratory employs a staff of 4,500 and has an annual budget of \$350 million.

In 1997-98, more than \$362 million in research awards were made to Berkeley faculty and researchers, 11% coming from the State of California.

UC Berkeley inventions were licensed by more than 45 companies across the nation, generating over \$1 million in licensing revenue in 1996-97.

UC Berkeley has spawned numerous biotech and high-tech companies, including Chiron Corporation – whose three founders, Ed Penhoet, William Rutter and Pablo Valenzuela, are all current or former UC faculty members – and Sybase, Inc., one of the world's largest independent software companies, co-founded by a UC Berkeley alumnus.
