Only the Colleges of Chemistry and Engineering will consider applications for second degrees. Dependent upon superior academic record, course preparation and change in objective	UCI does not accept applications into any majors in the School of Social Sciences or into Criminology, Law and Society, Psychology and Social Behavior, or the Social Ecology majors.	UCLA does not accept applications from students seeking second baccalaureate degrees in any area except Nursing.	Admission to a second bachelor's degree or limited status programs will be reviewed on a case by case basis.	Admission to a second bachelor's degree program requires the approval of the dean of the student's college.	UCSD does not accept applications from students seeking second baccalaureate degrees or from students seeking limited status.	UCSB accepts very few second baccalaureate degree candidates and admission is subject to approval by the college dean. New major must be in area different from first major.
