2007 UCLA Assistant Professor Survey


- 42% did NOT have a mentor
- 56% of those who did not have a mentor said they would like to have one
- In Physical Sciences only 25% had a mentor
- **32%** said it would be helpful to have a mentor outside their department

UCLA Council of Advisors (COA)

- Program goal: To provide career advice and guidance to assistant professors as they advance to the associate professorship
- Intended as supplement to mentoring provided in department
- Matches assistant professors with 1-2 full professors outside the department, includes former members of CAP

- Preparing for Academic Personnel Review (2x a year)
- Balancing Work and Life as an Assistant Professor




COA Program Growth 2009 - 2013








Advisee Participation 2009-2013 By Gender N= 98




Women are OVER-REPRESENTED in the Council of Advisors Asst. Prof. Campus statistics are 40% Women and 60% Men

Advisor Participation 2009-2013 By Gender N=133




Women are OVER-REPRESENTED in the Council of Advisors Full Professor Campus statistics are 25% Women and 75% Men

Advisee Participation 2009-2013 Race/Ethnicity N=98






Status of Advisees 2009 - 2013




2013 COA Advisee Survey

51 % response rate 76% Female, 24% Male 69% White 20% Asian 13% African American 4% Hispanic/Latino/a 2% Native American


How Valuable Has Your Participation in the COA Been For You? (Advisee)
