

- County pop 1.5M, city 500K
- One of the nation's biggest hub for recent refugees (Afghanistan)
- 1 in 5 live below the poverty line


Education


Systems








Improve Your Tomorrow mission is to increase the number of young men of color to attend and graduate from colleges and universities.

<u>IYT College to Community Pipeline</u> Lead Academic Mentor @ IYT Valley High School

- 100% High School Graduation rate as compared to 65% of Black males and 75% of Latino males in California
- 94% College attendance rate, as compared to 45% of African Americans and 47% of Latinos in California
- 92% College Retention Rate
- 68% A-G Completion Rate, as compared to 28.3% for African American males and 32% Latino males in California
- IYT students with 2 terms of participation showed a greater increase in GPA (+0.39) relative to the comparison group (+0.12). *EGUSD Evaluation*
- IYT students with 2 terms of participation increased credits earned (+1.68 compared to -1.45, a difference of 3.13 credits). *EGUSD Evaluation*
