- UC's online high school program
- Started 1999
- Big change in 2012: providing teachers
- Scout in one word: Access
- Can satisfy all a-g requirements with Scout
- Need to spread the word

## UC Scout ≠MOOC

Typically no credit granted.

Typically no transcripts.

Not high school classes.

Not used for college admissions.

MOOC	UC Scout
Tens of thousands of students in one course.	Max of 40 students in one course.

Typically credit granted.

Typically transcripts.

High school classes.

Typically proctored exams.

Used for college admissions.

Courses built to BOARS/CMP/a-g/College Board/NCAA/iNACOL/QM/FAIR standards.

Many assignments, projects, quizzes, and tests.

Most students enroll with the intention of finishing the course.

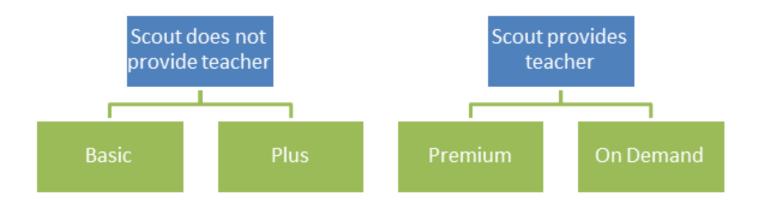
#### Where UC Scout students end up

- Independent study
- Middle school math
- Credit recovery
- Summer school
- Home/Hospital
- Young parent programs
- Supplement face to face course

- Computer lab: one class
- Computer lab: multiple classes
- No qualified teacher
