- Started 1999
- Big change in 2012: providing teachers
- Scout in one word: *Access*
- Can satisfy all a-g requirements with Scout
- Need to spread the word

Courses built however professors want (boutique approach).	Courses built to BOARS/CMP/a-g/College Board/NCAA/iNACOL/QM/FAIR standards.
Most students enroll with zero intention of ever completing the course.	Most students enroll with the intention of finishing the course.
Very few assignments, projects, quizzes, or tests.	Many assignments, projects, quizzes, and tests.
