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

- Targeting at-risk, low income, first-generation, and underrepresented students.
- Flexible framework for each UC SIP
- Advances & Supports student access to the UC system

Increase college-going rates and graduate and professional school enrollment among its target population of firstgeneration, low-income and underrepresented students.

Goal

Increase college-going rates and graduate/professional school enrollment

Objectives & Funding

- 50% of 12th grade students will enroll in postsecondary institutions
- 55% of graduating undergraduate volunteers will enroll in graduate school.




Cultural Identity

 - cultural awareness & development












SRRC Collaborative Model
