

Berkeley Moffitt Library Renovation Phase 1

FY of Approval: 2014-15

Project Description

- Phase 1 of comprehensive program renovation of the Moffitt Undergraduate Library (1970): future phases to occur as resources are secured.
- Renovation goal is to transform Moffitt into a 24-hour place conducive to group study, social interaction and team-based projects and presentations.
- Renovation also includes universal access and upgrades to obsolete building infrastructure, including provision of state-of-the-art information networks.
- Roof, elevator, and mechanical renewal already underway as part of campus financed capital renewal program.
- Phase 1 includes renovation of floors 4 and 5.
- Floor 5 is planned as a quiet floor - up to 10 group study rooms plus open seats for quiet work; self-serve computing/printing stations; ubiquitous wireless and power; library instruction classroom; code upgrades for life safety and access; improved rest rooms.
- Floor 4 is planned as a collaborative floor - up to 16 group study rooms plus one large flexible group room to be used and reconfigured as required by students/instructors; self-serve computing/printing stations; ubiquitous wireless and power; library instruction classroom; code upgrades for life safety and access; improved rest rooms.
