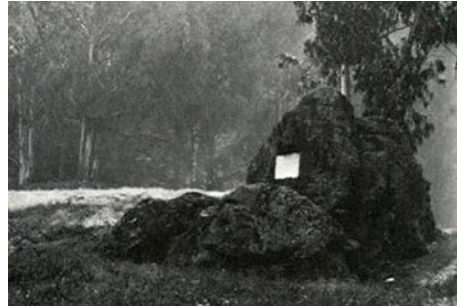

UC begins in 1868

From College of California to Founders Rock to the UC Berkeley campus in 1868



From the Toland Medical College to UC San Francisco in 1873



From the Los Angeles State Normal School to Southern Branch of University of California in 1919 to UCLA in 1951



UC opens six campuses...

The Santa Barbara State Normal School to Teachers College to State College to UC in 1944 soon becoming UC Santa Barbara



Riverside Citrus Experiment Station which eventually becomes the location for UC Riverside in 1954



Passage of the University Farm Bill led to the establishment of a UC farm school eventually becoming UC Davis in 1959

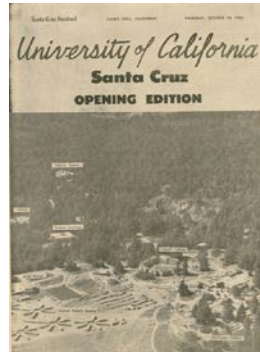

The Irvine Company donates land to UC to establish UC Irvine in 1965 to be the centerpiece of the new city of Irvine

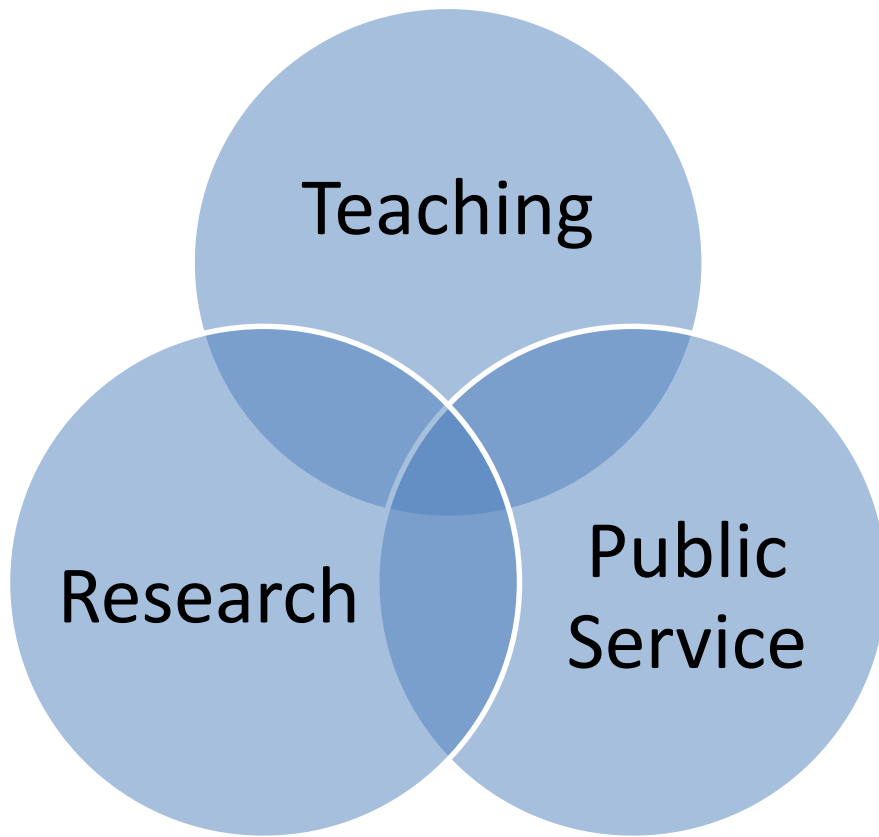


UC opens first American research university in the 21st century

UC Merced opens in 2005 and becomes the first American research university built in the 21st century

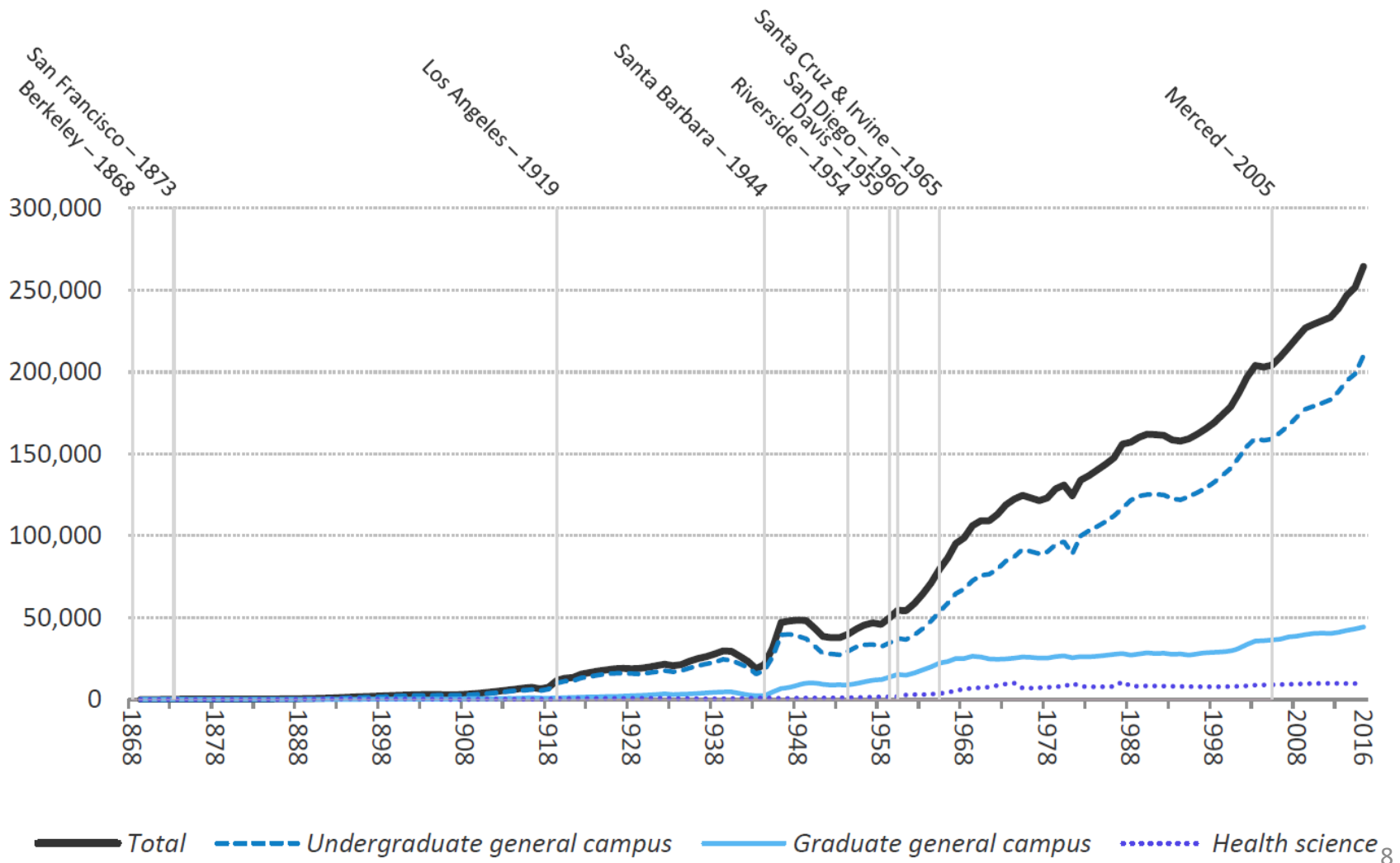


UC's primary mission under the California Master Plan



- UC is designated the State's primary academic research institution
- UC provides undergraduate, graduate and professional education
- UC has exclusive jurisdiction in public higher education for doctoral degrees and for instruction in law, medicine, dentistry, and veterinary medicine

UC began with 40 students. Today, UC enrolls over 270,000 with more than 2 million living alumni



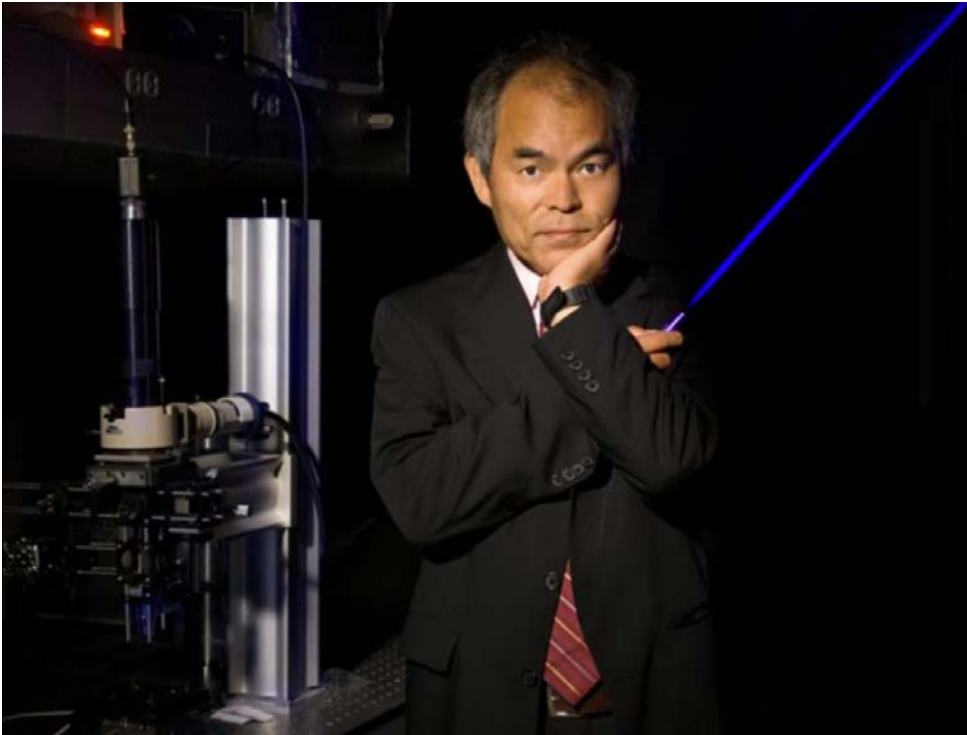
UC first class to most diverse class



- The 12 Apostles were UC's first graduating class
- Two years after opening eight women enrolled
- Today, five UC campuses are Hispanic serving institutions
- 57 of 58 CA counties, all 50 states, and 130 nations
- 42% of undergraduates are first generation students



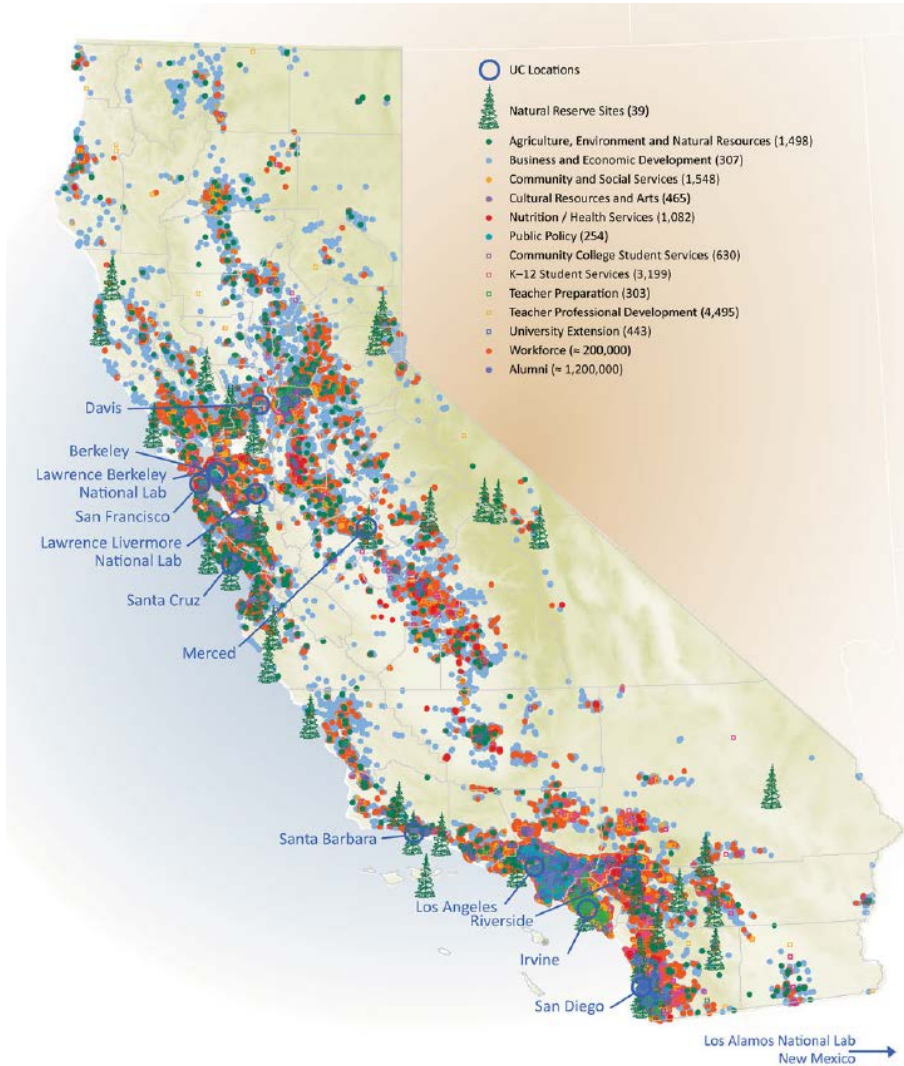

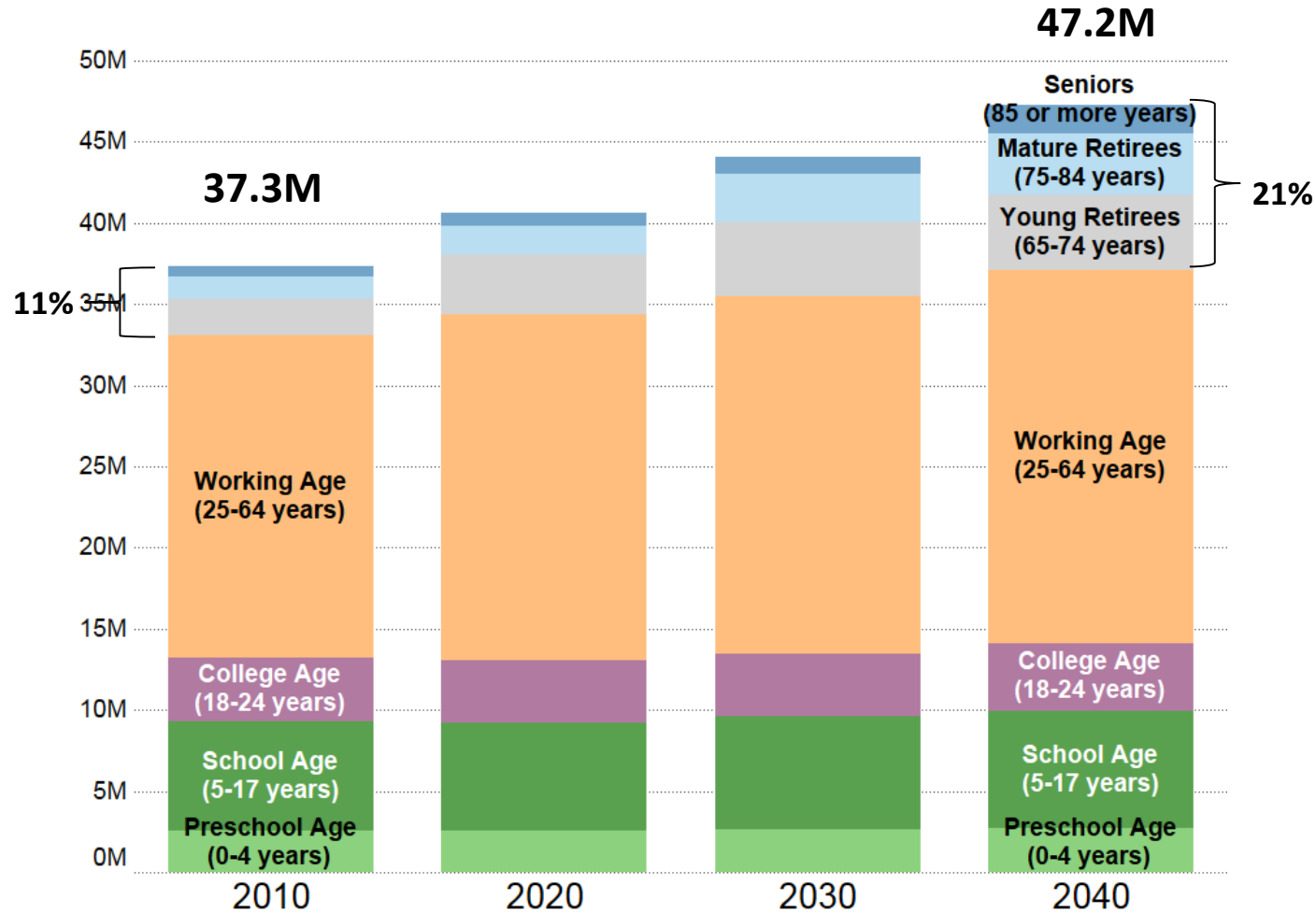

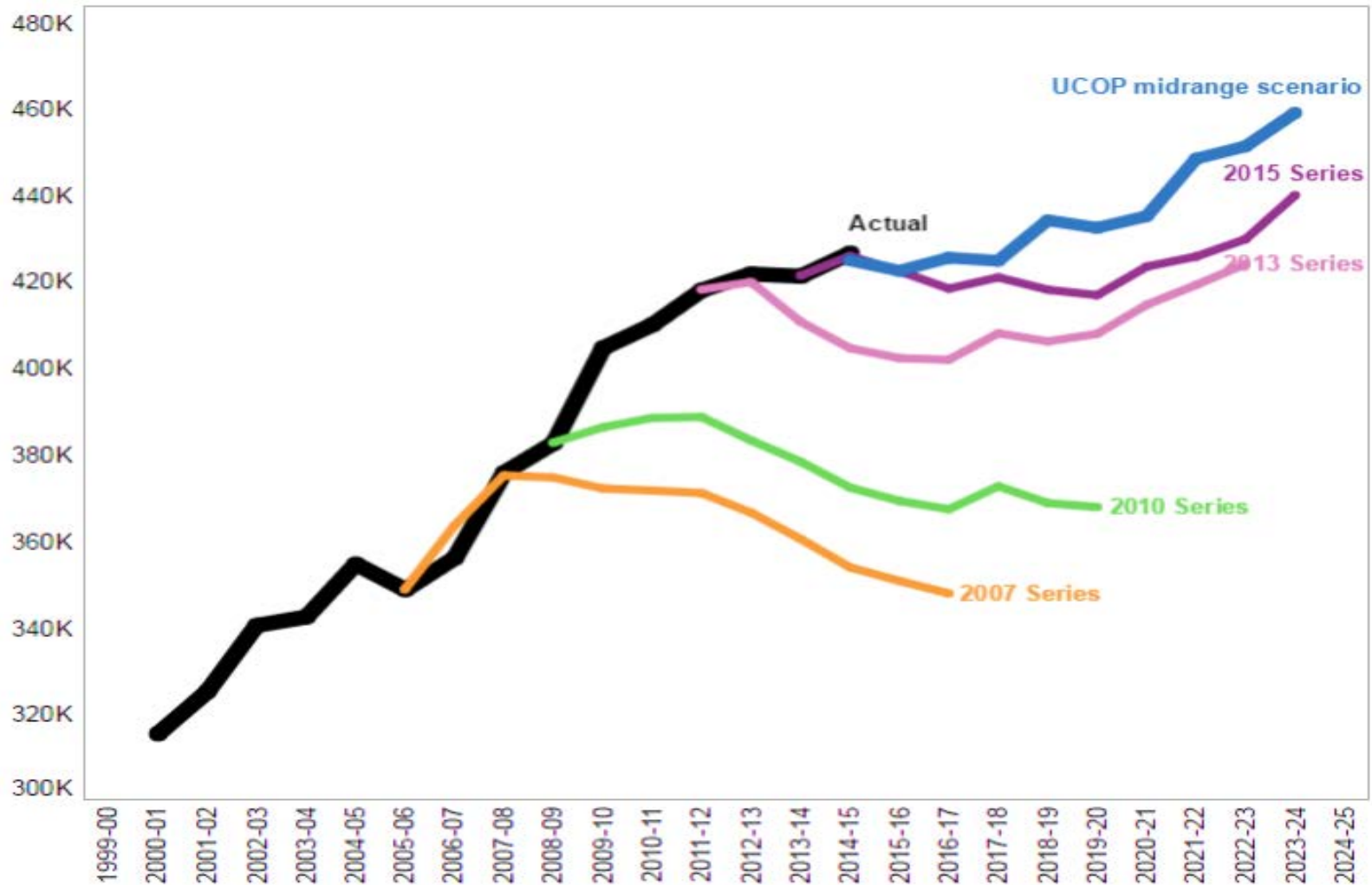
As baby boomers reach retirement age, a large number of workers with college degrees will leave the workforce

State population by age group from 2010 to 2040



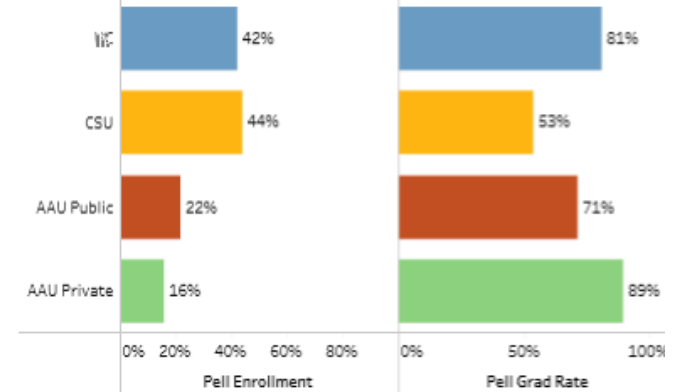
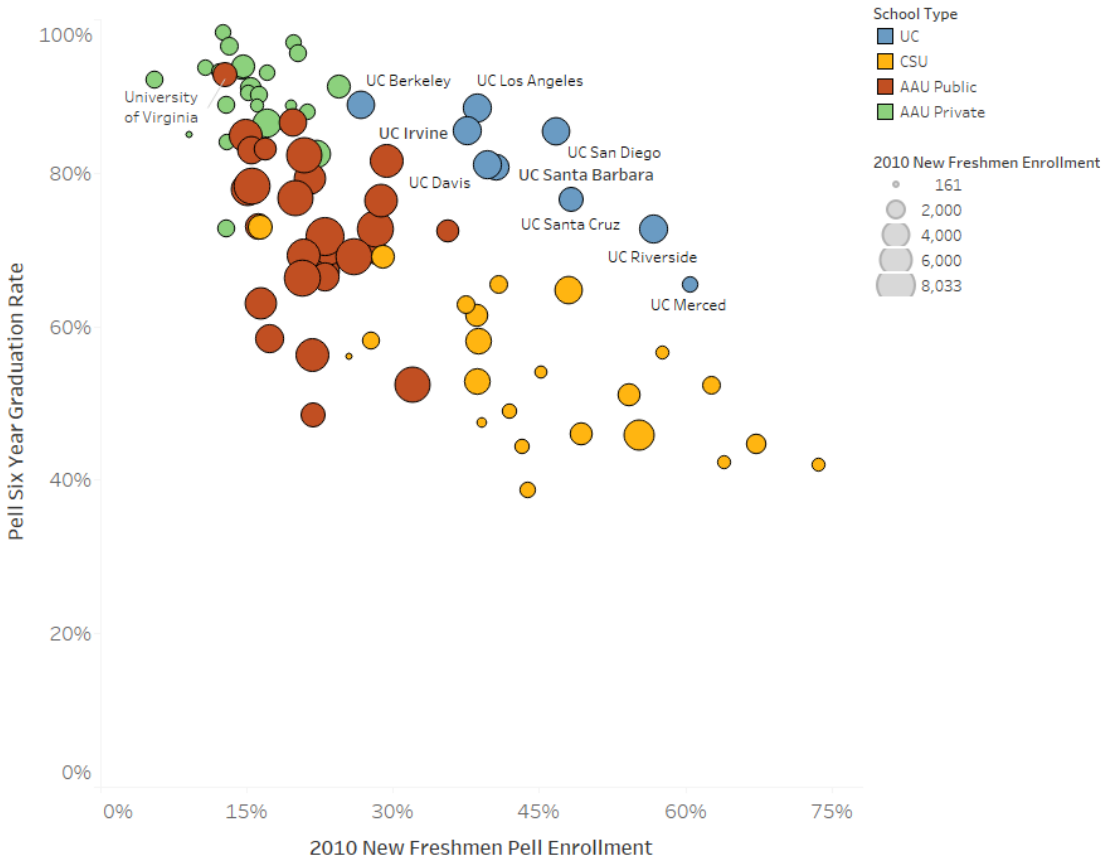
College age population expected to grow by 200K

UC advances economic mobility

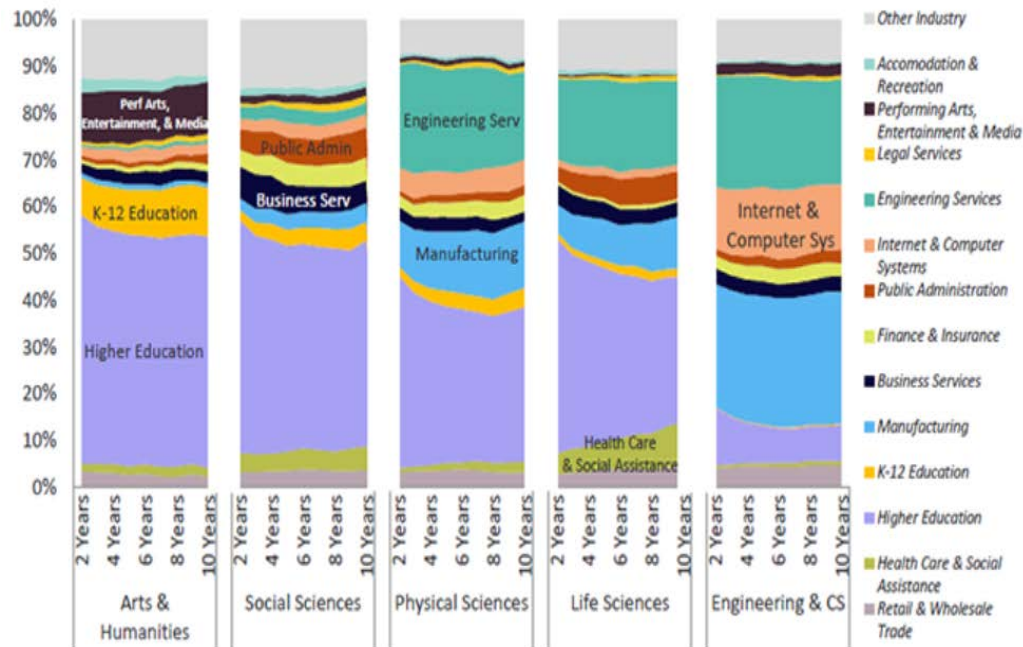
**Pell Enrollment vs. Pell Graduation Rates

UC is a leader in graduate education, particularly doctoral education

- **UC produces 63 percent of California's PhDs, 66 percent of the engineering and computer science, 76 percent of life science, 74 percent of physical science, and 71 percent of arts & humanities PhDs in the state**
- **Over half of them go on to work in the state's higher education workforce**
- **21 percent of CSU and 25 percent of UC tenured/tenure-track faculty earned their doctorate from UC**

UC RESEARCH IMPACTS IN CALIFORNIA

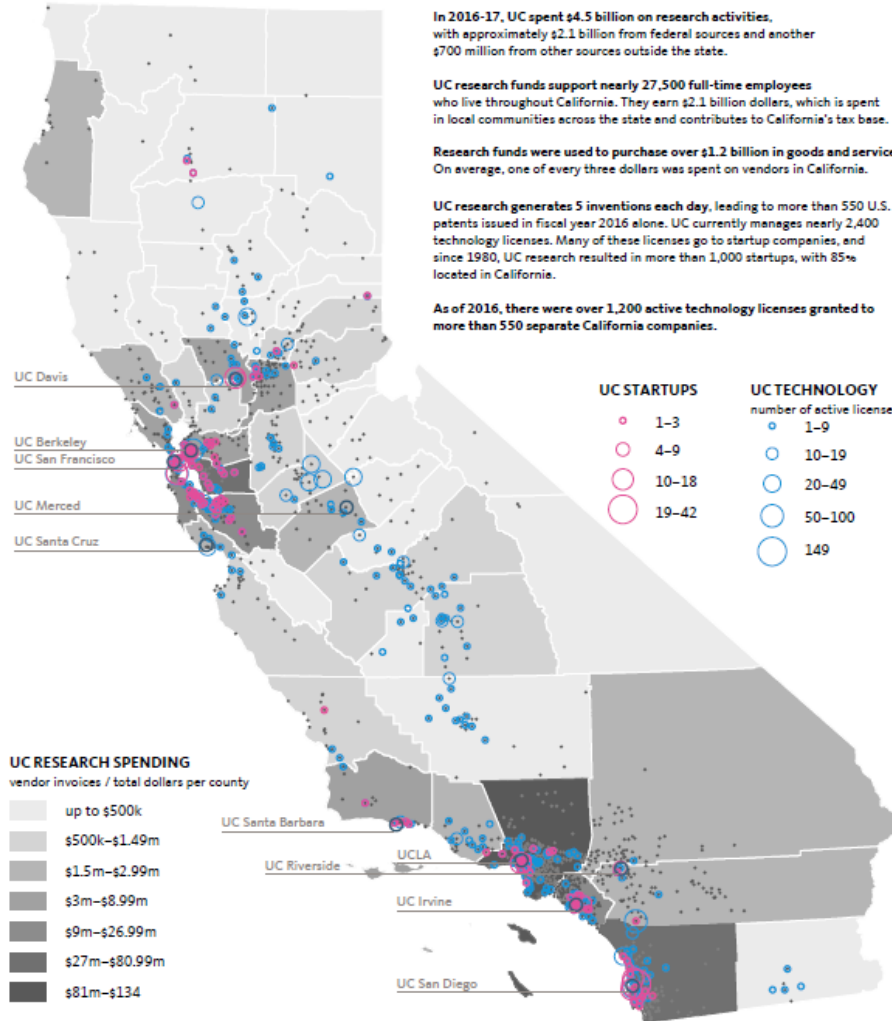
In 2016-17, UC spent \$4.5 billion on research activities, with approximately \$2.1 billion from federal sources and another \$700 million from other sources outside the state.

UC research funds support nearly 27,500 full-time employees who live throughout California. They earn \$2.1 billion dollars, which is spent in local communities across the state and contributes to California's tax base.

Research funds were used to purchase over \$1.2 billion in goods and services. On average, one of every three dollars was spent on vendors in California.

UC research generates 5 inventions each day, leading to more than 550 U.S. patents issued in fiscal year 2016 alone. UC currently manages nearly 2,400 technology licenses. Many of these licenses go to startup companies, and since 1980, UC research resulted in more than 1,000 startups, with 85% located in California.

As of 2016, there were over 1,200 active technology licenses granted to more than 550 separate California companies.

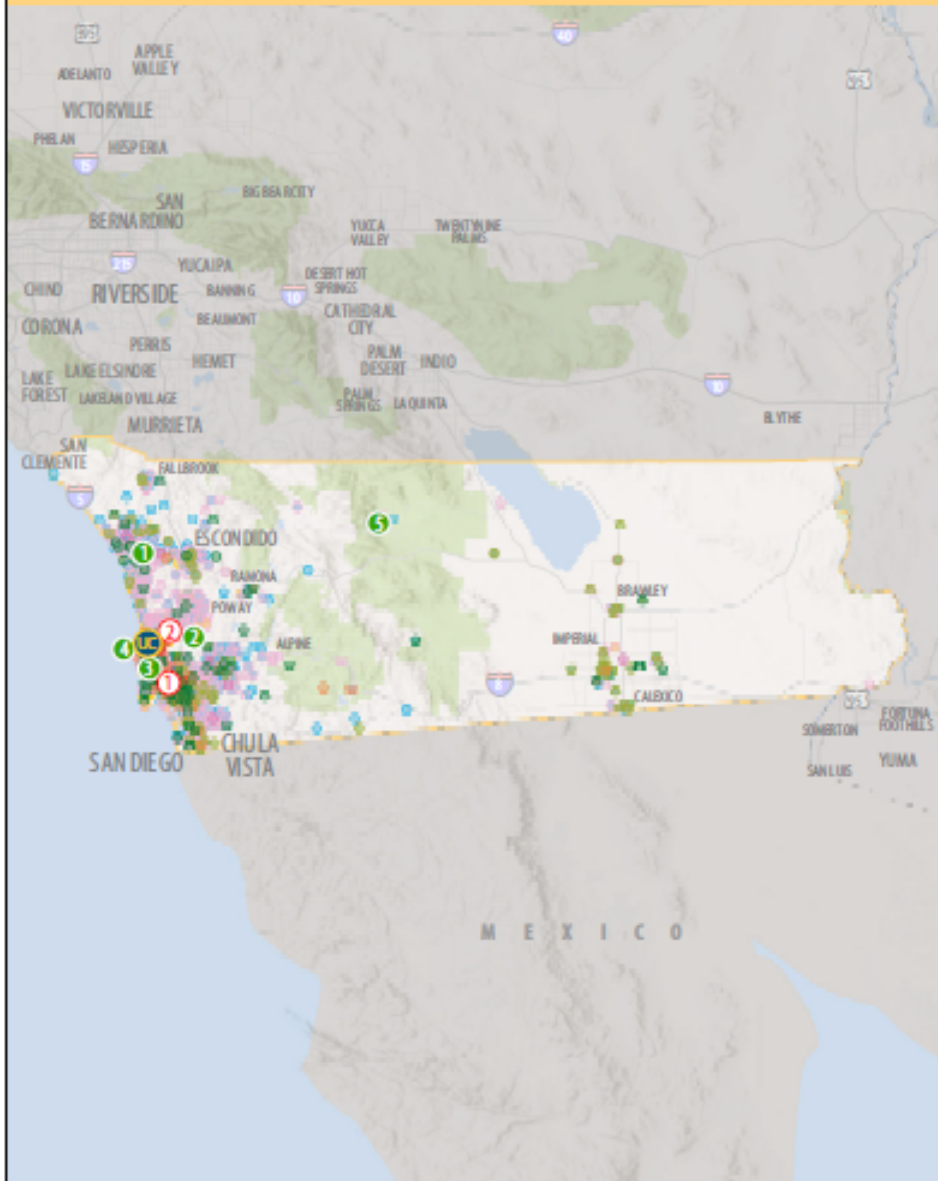
