The Universitywide SIR rate reflects the 'unduplicated' numbers – that is the rate of students admitted to the University who submitted a SIR to any UC campus. Because students can be admitted at more than one campus but only SIR to one campus, the Universitywide SIR rate can be higher than a SIR rate for each campus.
