

Fact Sheet: Fall 2023 Freshman and Transfer Admissions

The following data are preliminary, reflecting admission offers as of July 17, 2023.

The graphic below illustrates the application and admissions cycle. The data presented is subject to change as campuses continue to admit students from their waitlists and verify that conditions of admission are met. Yield data (percentage of students who accept an admission offer) on admission varies during different points in time, with some students who initially accept an offer changing their plans over the summer (referred to as a "melt"). Final enrollment data are reported by campuses in late fall and available to the public in the winter.



The preliminary data support the following:

- The admitted fall 2023 class of California freshmen is an all-time high, at over 88,200 students.
- Underrepresented students account for 44 percent of admitted California freshmen, the highest percentage and total number (over 38,800) in UC history.
- UC admitted about 24,700 California community college transfers, including about 23,000 residents.
- UC continues to honor its commitment to the California Master Plan for Higher Education by guaranteeing freshman admission to a UC campus (though not necessarily to the campus of choice) to students in the top 9 percent of their high school or top 9 percent of the state without considering standardized test scores.

In fall 2022, UC enrollments grew by about 750 California residents compared to fall 2021. UC has added nearly 22,000 additional California residents (fall headcount) since 2015.
