# **Comparisons of Undergraduate Experience between First-Year Stopouts and Persisting Students**



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## Quotes from the University of California Stopouts Survey

- 1. "I believe one of the major reasons why [I left UC xxx] was I didn't feel belonging to my previous school..."
- 2. "I dropped out in 2008 as the recession made it difficult to work part time and also attend college."
- 3. "I dropped out of UC xxx because my financial aid got messed up. I was too poor to do anything else about, and I already was working a job..."
- 4. "I dropped out due to financial difficulties."
- 5. "I dropped out of UC xxx three times, was homeless before dropping out the last time."
- 6. "The reason I left UC xxx was because the advisors were very unhelpful to me..." "There were too many students and not enough professors."
- 7. "My father passed away 11 days before my last quarter."
- 8. "The reason I dropped out of college was due to being overwhelmed and it has taken me years to work through that depression. So it really was a multitude of reasons instead of just a singular cause."

## Research purpose and questions


This study compares student experience between the first-year persisting students and stopouts based on the University of California Undergraduate Experience Survey (UCUES) data.

- 1. Is there any significant difference in student experience between the first-year stopouts and persisting students?
- 2. How much can student experience predict the first year persistence?

## The University of California Undergraduate Experience Survey (UCUES)

- The University of California administers UCUES to all undergraduate student once every other year.
- The response rates range from 33% to 41% from 2006 to 2020.
- The response rate varies slightly across student characteristics.
- Respondents are fairly representative of population.

Response rates by student characteristics for the 2020 UCUES



### Level of academic satisfaction


How satisfied or dissatisfied are you with the following aspects of your campus experiences/education?

#### Response scale (numeric value):

Very dissatisfied (1); Dissatisfied (2); Somewhat dissatisfied (3); Somewhat satisfied (4); Satisfied (5); Very satisfied (6)

**Total score**: sum of values on all four items, ranging from 4 (very dissatisfied, vd) – 24 (very satisfied, vs)



## Sense of belonging


Please select your level of agreement or disagreement with the following statements.

- 1. I feel that I belong at this campus.
- 2. I feel valued as an individual on this campus.
- 3. Knowing what I know now I would still choose to enroll at this University.
- 4. At UC, I have been excluded from study groups because of my group membership (reversed)
- 5. I am proud to be a student at this campus.

#### Response scale (numeric value):

Strongly disagreed (1); Disagreed (2); Somewhat disagreed (3); Somewhat agreed (4); Agreed (5); Strongly agreed (6)

**Total score**: sum of values on five items, ranging from 5 (strongly disagreed, sd) – 30 (strongly agreed, sa)



## Perception of campus climate


## Please select your level of agreement or disagreement with the following statements.

- 2-4. I feel comfortable with the climate for diversity and inclusiveness at UC/my class/my major.

- 13. My campus is a safe and secure campus.

#### Response scale (numeric value):

- 1. Strongly disagreed (1)
- 2. Disagreed (2)
- 3. Somewhat disagreed (3)
- 4. Somewhat agreed (4)
- 5. Agreed (5)
- 6. Strongly disagreed (6)

**Total score**: sum of values on five items, ranging from 13 (very negative perception, vnp) – 78 (very positive perception, vpp)



**Total score**: sum of values on 10 items, ranging from 10 (very disengaged, vd) – 60 (very engaged, ve)





#### Response scale (numeric value):

- 1. Strongly disagreed (6); Never(1); No concerned (1)
- 2. Disagree (5); Rarely(2); Somewhat disagree (4);
- 3. Somewhat disagree (4); Occasionally(3)
- 4. Somewhat agree (3); Somewhat often(4); somewhat concerned (2)
- 5. Agree (2); Often(5); Concerned (3);
- 6. Strongly agree (1) Very often(6); Very concerned (4);


**Total score**: sum of values on five items, ranging from 4 (not concerned, nc) – 20 (very concerned, vc)




## Predicted probabilities for persistence by experience factor at each campus



















## Predicted probabilities for persistence by top single items at each campus


hours spent on paid employment off campus per week










## Summary...

- There is a significant difference of the first year experience between stopouts and persisting students. Stopouts were significantly less satisfied with their experience, spent more time working on a paid employment job outside the campus, less felt they belonged at the campus, and more concerned about their financial situation than persisting students.
- 2. Level of satisfaction with academic experience, sense of belonging, paid employment hours, campus climate, and academic engagement are strong predictors of persistence on all campuses and for all racial/ethnic groups.
- 3. NEXT STEPS FOR CAMPUSES TO DO:
  - 1) Foster a sense of belonging on campus.
  - 2) Change campus climate, so everyone feels deeply welcomed, inclusive, and respected.
  - 3) Help students solve financial problems, so they can focus on study.
  - 4) Inspire student engagement
  - 5) Satisfy their academic needs and interest.
