

## 2025 UC Graduate Student Experience Survey administration report

The UC Graduate Student Experience Survey (UCGSES) was administered to over 60,000 graduate and professional students at all 10 UC campuses and received over 12,000 completed responses. This report provides summaries on survey duration, completion and response rates, and representativeness.

### Survey duration

UCGSES was launched across a two-month period with the earliest launch on February 11, 2025 (UC Santa Cruz) and latest launch on April 7, 2025 (UC Merced). The survey was closed for all campuses by June 30, 2025 with an average of 84 active days for each campus compared to 76 in 2023. On average, 9 email reminder messages (not including invitation emails) were sent for each campus, compared to 9 in 2023 (Table 1).

### Completion rates, response rates, and representativeness

Tables 2-3 provide information on completion and response rates by campus and representativeness by gender and race/ethnicity.

**Response rate** refers to the percentage of students surveyed who answered at least one survey question after the consent form, regardless of submitting the survey or not. The overall response rate is 22 percent, which is less than the 2023 response rate of 26 percent. Campus response rates vary from 18 to 43 percent (Table 2).

**Completion rate** refers to the percentage of students who completed and submitted the survey (students are allowed to skip questions) relative to the total number of respondents, who responded to at least one survey item after the consent form. The overall completion rate is 90 percent, which is 6% more than the 2023 completion rate. Campus completion rates vary from 87 to 95 percent (Table 2).

**Representativeness** is a measure to indicate the degree to which survey respondents represent the population. We determined representativeness by comparing respondents and the population by key characteristics, such as gender, race/ethnicity, residency, discipline, etc. In general, the respondents are representative of the population by most demographics. However, respondents identifying as women are overrepresented by about six percentage points and respondents identifying as men are underrepresented by about six percentage points (Table 3).
