Over the past 3 years, UC San Diego Health had experienced increasing loss days, so the collaborators took a deep dive of the data, then they looked at how they could improve the entire process. They focused on: ensuring timely claims filings, removing communication barriers for injured employees, and ensuring injured employees were getting timely medical treatments.
